

Opening Letter:

We have just entered our third year as an organization and our third year working with the community of Piñán. For all of our supporters that have watched our progress from the start, this will be a pivotal year with the project. By the end of it we will see a fully established high-school in Piñán, built by the hands of the community and operating for them; Piñán's first year with access to a complete education system, including all grades in the school curriculum, from primary to graduation, and right in their own community.

This year did present some significant challenges due to the global pandemic. Ecuador was the most effected country in all of Latin America, with a tragic outcome. Significant barriers throughout the country slowed some of our work there. Ecuador closed many of its borders including those around ecological reserves where many remote indigenous communities, seen as more vulnerable to the virus and having no access to health services, live. This included the Cotacachi-Cayapas reserve, where Piñán is located.

However, We kept up our communications with all of our working partners and found ways to persevere. We moved some of our targets ahead by one year, such as the construction of the school to this following September of 2021, and found ways to adapt our fundraising strategies. As the government offices and universities we work with in Ecuador began to re-mobilize, the project found its stride again and now we're looking at our busiest and most ambitious year yet!

Our Network is shaping up, with volunteers, committees and supporters accross several continents, and we'd like to thank each one of you for the part you play in building stronger, more sustainable and connected communities!

The Year's Achievements

- The second year of high school classes are up and running in Piñán.
- We've hired two new qualified teachers with collaboration of Cotacachi District of Education.
- 10 Computers and 1 projector have been delivered to Ecuador and have arrived in Piñán for installation in one of the primary classrooms.
- Rumble for the Jungle: An overly theatrical fundraiser like no other was put on in Nelson last January with a whole team of creative volunteers from the Kootenays. It was a huge success ans we can't wait until we can run this one again!
- Our designs for the school have been completed by architects at the University of Azuay.
- We've started preparing for our big construction project: The three high school classrooms in Piñán. The community has started working as a cohesive crew to prepare the wood and adobe bricks that will be used for the construction.
- We're now working with a committed network of official volunteers and partners in Ecuador that are dedicated to seeing Piñán's vision become a reality.


Minga is a Kichwa word meaning work that a community does together, for the benefit of the whole community. It feels great to have the whole community so involved in this project for their youth!

- Coordinate community construction activities to provide employment within the community throughout the year.

- Transition high school classes and equipment into the new classrooms for Sept. 2021
